DeLaSalle Connects With Kenya

Group To Visit Christian Brother Ministries In East African Nation In Summer of 2007

As part of DeLaSalle's long-standing commitment to diversity education, the Lasallian Ministry department is sponsoring a five-week immersion trip to Kenya, East Africa during the summer of 2007.

The students who will participate in the experience will live, serve and study side-by-side with students in two Lasallian schools in Kenya.

Ms. Peg Hodapp, Vice President for Mission, is organizing the trip.

In addition to a structured day of prayer, study, arts, athletics and community service, DeLaSalle students will learn basic Swahili, interview people from the different tribes for a reflection paper, and discover the culture and history of the Kenyan people. There will also be an opportunity for day trips to various parts of the country including all of the Lasallian Ministries in Kenya, game parks and a concluding trip to the city of Nairobi.

Kenya is one of 19 African countries where the Christian Brothers have devoted many years of service and education. Today, they work in Marsabit, Nairobi (the capital city), Nakuru, Nyeri and Rongai. In Kenya there are many Lasallian ministries including

elementary, middle and high schools, a novitiate for young Brothers and several other types of social service agencies.

St. Paul's Secondary School, the boarding school where the DeLaSalle students will spend their first four weeks, is in Marsabit, the poorest area of Kenya. Traveling to this town in the northern part of Kenya is arduous because of poor roads. The area has little infrastructure. Child mortality is the highest in the country,

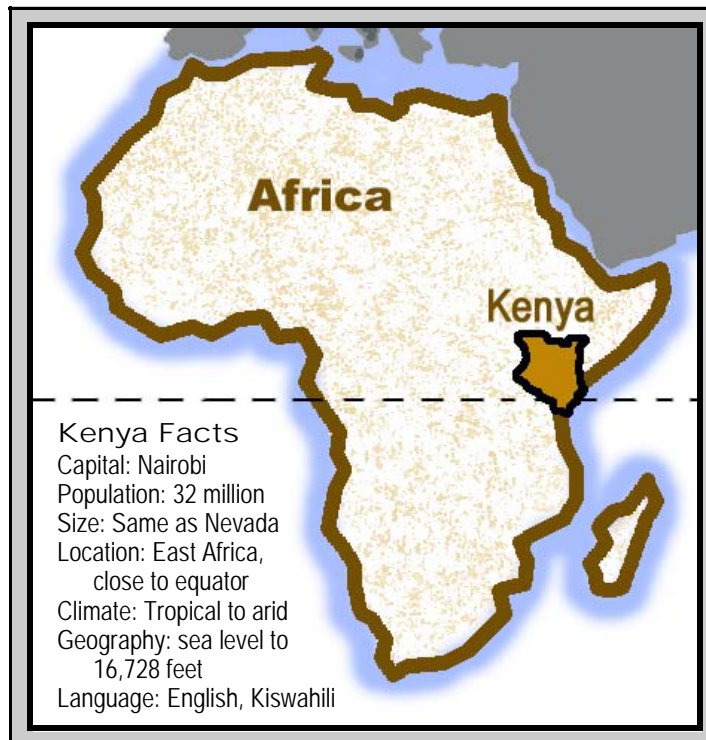
and life expectancy is the lowest in Kenya. An unskilled worker in Marsabit usually earns about two dollars a day.

The DeLaSalle group—17 students and three staff members—will be guided by Bro. Chuck Gregor, FSC, from Christian Brothers College (CBC) High School in St. Louis, MO. He took four CBC students on a similar immersion trip in the summer of 2006.

Bro. Chuck worked in Kenya for five years so he is familiar with the country and language. While in Kenya, he opened the Mwangaza Center for Skills Formation, a trade school in Kenya that is DeLaSalle's

"twin" school. DeLaSalle students have raised money yearly for Mwangaza through out-of-uniform days and other events.

DLS hopes that its representatives will be able to present Mwangaza and the other schools money and supplies that will enhance their educational programs.

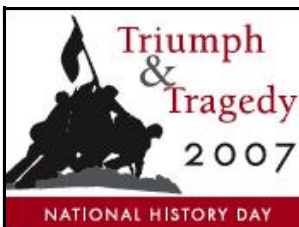

Library Corner

Literary Reference Center (LRC) is a full-text database that combines information from over 1,000 books and monographs, major literary encyclopedias and reference works, hundreds of literary journals, and unique sources not available anywhere else. *LRC* is a comprehensive database containing detailed information on the most studied authors and their works.

From the home page, one may perform a keyword search for an author or work; browse authors or works; select one of the resource books highlighted, such as literary themes or criticisms; utilize the tools in the reference shelf; or view one of the works that are currently highlighted or the author in focus.

When performing a search, it is best to start as general as possible. With the search results screen there will be options of selecting subject headings to narrow one's results list. When viewing the results, notice the tabs along the top of the screen. They will help a researcher to view only biographical information, literary criticism, master plots, reviews, reference books, poems, stories or magazine articles.

LRC includes more than 10,000 plot summaries, synopses and work overviews; 75,000 articles of literary criticism; 130,000 author biographies; full text of many classic and contemporary poems, short stories and novels; over 3,000 author interviews; and over 1,000 images of key literary figures.

To access this database via the DLS Web site, click on the Library Resources link on its home page. Next, click on Research tools and then online databases. The *LRC* will appear in the middle of the list.

DLS encourages students to see Ms. Roggow for help using this tool and any of the many databases to which the school has access. This tool is also available from home or at the public library. Be sure to pick up a remote logon access sheet from the DeLaSalle Library or Tech Lab.

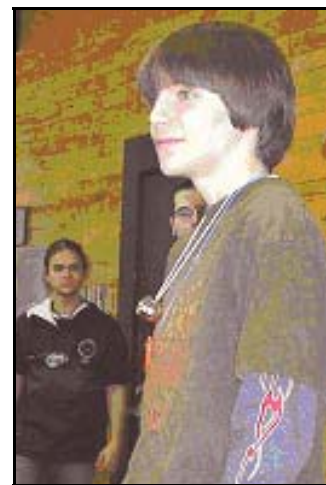
German Students Return To Waldsee

Help Your Teen Use Study Time Well

As each new year begins, people often make resolutions to improve themselves. This tradition dates nearly 2000 years to the Romans. They named the first month of the year Janus after their god who looked backward and forward in time because he had two faces.

The celebration of New Year's Day is a good time to put a new face on one's work and study habits. It is a good time to check to see if your teen is getting the most out of his/her study time. Here are some study tips to help your teen become a more efficient and effective learner.



1. **Use your daily planner** – You can't do homework if you don't know what the assignment is and note when it is due.
2. **Study difficult (or boring) subjects first** – The courses we find most difficult often require the most creative energy. Save the subject you enjoy for later.
3. **Be aware of your best time for studying** – Many people learn best during daylight hours. Find a time when learning feels best for you.
4. **Use a regular study area** – Your mind and body know where you are. They become trained. Use your study area for study and make it a ritual.
5. **Make study time a regular part of your daily schedule** – Getting into a habit of study makes the whole process easier and more effective.
6. **Study where you'll be alert** – In bed, your body gets a signal, "time to sleep." Avoid other dangerous places like a very comfortable chair or couch.
7. **Use a library or study hall** – These are perfect places for studying and learning.
8. **Get off the phone, cell phone, or computer** – These items are notorious for creating distractions. Turn them off and study in another room.
9. **Learn to say no** – This is a timesaver and valuable life skill for everyone.
10. **Avoid noise distractions** – Avoid TV, music, and friends that like to talk rather than study.
11. **Notice how others intrude on your time and do something about it** – Ask yourself if certain friends or relatives consistently interrupt your study time. Seek a kind yet firm solution to this situation.
12. **Take breaks** – How often? Each person's need are different. Some students accomplish more in an hour's time if they work 15 minutes and take a five-minute break and keep repeating this schedule. Others are more productive if they work longer with fewer breaks. Be careful to stay on a schedule and don't let those breaks become too long!

The next ACT test is February 10, 2007.

The registration deadline is January 5, 2007. Registrations will be accepted January 6-19, 2007, but they will also be assessed a late fee.

Registration packets are available in the Guidance and Counseling Department. One may also register online at www.actstudent.org. The code for DeLaSalle High School is 241-600.

DeLaSalle Financial Aid Applications Due

Financial Aid applications for the 2007-08 year at DeLaSalle are available as early as January 4 in the Business Office. Once again, over \$1 million in aid will be made available to DeLaSalle families through this program, the majority of which is raised by DeLaSalle's Development efforts. The **deadline** for completing an application (one per family) is **Monday, February 26, 2007**. DeLaSalle strongly encourages returning students to participate in the process by picking up the application before or after school.



The Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis, which helps coordinate the program for all Catholic high schools, has again chosen a new vendor, Tuition Aid Data Services (TADS), to process applications for DeLaSalle and other Catholic schools.

FAFSA Application Due

What is the FAFSA? It is the form that the government uses to determine a college student's eligibility for aid, which can include scholarships, grants, work-study and loans. In order to complete the FAFSA (Free Application For Federal Student Aid), individuals need to have their 1040 tax return (2005 version) for reporting taxes. Plan to complete taxes as soon as W-2 forms are received.

Where can one obtain a FAFSA application?

- On the Web site www.fafsa.ed.gov
- In the DLS Guidance and Counseling office
- In a local public library
- By calling 1-800-FED-AID / 1(800) 433-3243

When should the FAFSA be completed? The FAFSA application should be completed as soon as possible after January 1 of each year. It is wise to keep copies of all submitted documents.

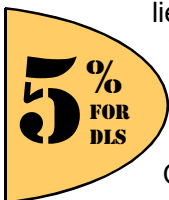
ITED, PLAN, PSAT Test Results Distributed
