Hallman's Challenge: Make King's Dream Be Our Reality

On the Friday before Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Rev. Marchelle Hallman spoke to DeLaSalle's students and staff with the warmth of a mother of two (*C.J. Hallman '02 and Johnell Hallman '04*),

the enthusiasm of a youth minister, and the inner conviction of a prison chaplain. Her reflections on the civil right leader from the 1960s focused on love, self-control, and justice.

Hallman, the pastor of St. James A.M.E. church in Minneapolis and a chaplain at Lino Lakes Correctional facility, challenged the DeLaSalle audience to bring to life Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s dream of justice and peace among people of all kinds of backgrounds. To do this, she said we need to embrace love, quoting King who said, "Hatred darkens life; love illuminates it."

As we embrace love, Hallman said, we need to be intentional about it, that is, to love on purpose, to love when it is difficult to do so, to love so that justice comes into the world around us. "You must be self controlled, seeking to study hard and develop your mind, use your gifts and abilities to help those in need."

In doing this, Hallman said, we make King's dream our reality.

During the prayer service remembering the legacy of Martin Luther King, Jr., Samantha Schrepfer '12 prayed the hymn "The Spirit of the Lord" in sign language.

Wrestling and basketball seasons are coming to an end and we would like to remind all fans of some very important information. Sportsmanship plays an integral role in the success of our programs. The Minnesota State High School League sets all admission prices for wrestling sections and those admission prices are \$6.00 for students/seniors and \$8.00 for adults. These admission prices are good for an all day section wrestling event.

Basketball playoffs begin early in March. The first round girls' game is on March 3 and the first round boys' game is on March 10. The higher seeded school serves as host to the first round games, both for the boys' and girls' games. For ALL playoff games everyone must pay admission. The Minnesota State High School League sets all admission prices for basketball section play and those admission prices are as follows: Adult admission price is \$8 and student/senior admission price is \$6 for a double header and adult admission price is \$7 and student/senior admission price is \$5 for a single game.

Library Corner

Do you have a paper due for your English class? Need some information for a theology report? Looking for some images or a video clip to jazz up your science report? Are you finding limited information searching Google for a project that is due in Social Studies? If you answered yes to any of these questions or have a project due in any of your classes, try **Ebscohost 2.0**.

You have many options for searching when you enter the EBSCOhost service. You can click on EBSCOhost Web and do a power search of several databases within the service. An alternative would be to individually search specific databases such as the Literary Reference Center for help with your English research or Consumer Health Complete, the Science Database or Points of View for other projects you may have.

The interface for EBSCOhost is easy to use with enhanced features such as image and video searching, personalized folders to store your results and specific articles, and improved results rankings. This year we have access to even more information through EBSCOhost with new databases in the areas of Science, Health, Points of View as well as the AP database. EBSCOhost provides you with range of articles on topics from advanced college level to popular journals. Please stop in and ask Ms. Roggow for help with your search strategy.

To use this database when on campus, select the Library Resources Web page from the Students section of the main DeLaSalle website. Next select → Online Databases → EBSCOhost. Students are encouraged to visit the Library for help using this tool and any of the many databases to which DeLaSalle has access. This is also available from home or the public library. Be sure to pick up a remote logon access sheet from the DLS Library or Tech Lab.

Classes of 2012, 2013, 2014

Register for DeLaSalle

As mentioned in Brother Michael Collin's letter mailed home on January 13, enrollment and course registration for the 2011-12 school year occurs in late-February and early-March.

For the Classes of 2012-2013-2014, materials will be distributed in assemblies on Thursday, February 17. Parents must return a signed 2011-12 Enrollment Contract and the non-refundable \$300.00 Registration Fee deposit by Friday, February 25. In the meantime, current students will work closely with teachers and their parents to select courses for 2011-12. In some cases, teacher approval is required for registration into the course. Student selections should both fulfill graduation requirements and fit with their post-secondary plans.

Once a parent has returned the signed Enrollment Contract and paid the registration fee deposit (which enrolls a child for next year), then students will be able to register for courses online, confirming their selections through the DeLaSalle website. This process will occur at school during designated registration times during the first week of March.

As for the Class of 2015, the DeLaSalle Office of Admission is pleased to report that all important interest indicators are strong. On January 15, DE hosted the largest number of eighth graders on the primary Entrance Exam date since the early 1970s. The applicant pool as of that date already exceeded 300 students, including a minimum of ten applicants apiece from each of ten different Catholic elementary schools, another "first time in decades" occurrence. With guarded optimism, we thank all current parents and students for their many positive referrals, and we are excited about the next four years.

We are still receiving new inquiries each day, and hosting a minimum of three make-up exams. The "early-decision" deadline for families to complete ninth grade applications is Friday, February 11. DE will respond to applicants and their families on February 18. Enrollment and course registration for the Class of 2015 is scheduled for Saturday, February 26.

Parent Association Meets February 7

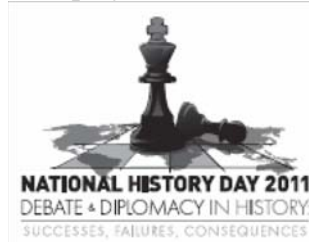
Parents To Study Teen Drug and Alcohol Scene

DeLaSalle parents are invited to the Parent Association meeting on Monday, Feb 7 at 6:00 P.M. in the R. Casanova Room. The guest speaker will be Ms. Julie Young-Burns from Minneapolis Public Schools.

Her presentation, as part of the Safe & Drug-Free Schools Program, gives parents an overview of drugs and alcohol and the realities that teens face. She will cover adolescent substance use, prevention strategies, and setting family rules and expectations about alcohol and drugs. She also includes education on what drugs are fashionable right now and the implements that are used to deliver them. All DLS parents are welcome.

History Day: Step Back in Time on February 22

Each year 11th graders at DeLaSalle participate in History Day, a nationwide program for students in grades 6-12. The emphasis is for students to do history-become historians. Each year a theme is established around which individual and group projects are created. This year's theme is "**Debate and Diplomacy in History: Successes, Failures and Consequences.**" Beginning at the school level and on through regional and state competitions student projects are judged upon the degree and competency of each project's historical accuracy, analysis and interpretation.



The best projects from each state advance to the National History Day contest, held in Washington, D.C., in early June 2011.

To present their findings students have five options: research paper, exhibit,

dramatic performance, web page or documentary. Completed projects will be on display at the DeLaSalle History Day on February 22, 2011 in the Monsignor Coates Library.

An Open House will follow from 6:00 to 8:30 P.M. All are invited to examine exhibits, read research papers, navigate web sites, view documentaries and watch compelling performances. In the past many of our projects have advanced to the state and national competitions and been awarded some of the top prizes.

Judges are needed that day, on the 22nd, to help determine the best projects at DeLaSalle. In the past judges have included parents, teachers, past History Day participants (state qualifiers) and friends of DeLaSalle. Judges do not affect the grade a student will earn for the project. If you enjoy history, scholastic endeavors or still enjoy learning, you qualify as a judge. This will require about 45 minutes of your time (longer if you want) anytime between 9:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. on February 22. Parents of 11th graders may not judge. If interested in being a judge, contact Mr. Martin Marrin at (612) 676-7600.

Test Interpretation Night on February 2:

Regarding the standardized tests the students took in October, the counselors will offer an opportunity for parents/guardians to find out how to understand **what their students' scores mean** as well as how these scores are used by DeLaSalle, how students and parents can best use them, and how they relate to college entrance exams.

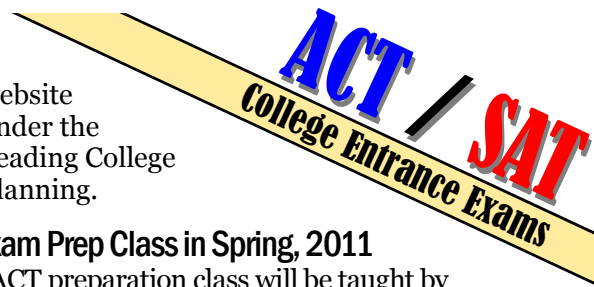
Location: Robert Casanova Room. For those who will be attending multiple sessions, the library will be available as a waiting area.

Attention 11th Graders: College Entrance Exams

All students need to take a college entrance exam as part of the college admissions process. Counselors urge 11th graders to take one of these two tests, ACT or SAT, in spring of their junior year.

- **ACT:** DeLaSalle will be administering the April ACT Test. Take it at DE for the “home field advantage.” Apply as early as possible for the June test because spaces will fill up quickly. Check the ACT website www.act.org for more information and to register online.
- **SAT:** DeLaSalle is not a test center site for the SAT. This test is given on May 7 and on June 4. Students may obtain more information and register online at www.collegeboard.com.
- **Practice and Prediction:** Students have had the opportunity to practice for the SAT during the fall of junior year with the PSAT. While interpreting the PSAT results for juniors, counselors were able to advise students to use their PSAT scores to predict results on the SAT. In the same way, PLAN scores from the 10th grade year will provide predictions of success on the ACT.
- **Applications and Test Prep Materials:** These materials are available in the Guidance and Counseling Office for those who prefer to fill out the paper application. ***If students have any questions pertaining to these tests or if they are confused about which test to take they should consult with a counselor.*** More information about the tests appear in the DLS College Planning Guide which is available in the Guidance and Counseling Office and on the DLS

website under the heading College Planning.



ACT Exam Prep Class in Spring, 2011

An ACT preparation class will be taught by Ms. Mary Ann Dorsher, a current De parent and certified exam prep teacher from ACT Ready (www.actready.net). The class will have six sessions ending right before the June ACT test date. This is a great deal at \$75! Financial assistance is available if needed. The class is limited, first come first serve. Pick up more specific information in the Guidance and Counseling Office.

11th Graders Plan Ahead, Search Now

Aside from taking college entrance exams in the spring, there are *lots* of things 11th graders can do to be best prepared for college application process. **A most important step in the college search is the making of an appointment to meet with a counselor** in the Guidance and Counseling Office. Parents are welcome to attend these meetings with students. Other useful steps are:

- Do a college search on MCIS or collegeboard.com.
- Attend the spring College Fair hosted at Benilde-St. Margaret on April 12.
- Visit college campuses over spring break.
- Visit with college representative this spring as they visit DeLaSalle to recruit the class of 2011.

College Planning Night

We would like to strongly encourage all 11th graders and their parents to attend College Planning Night on **Wednesday, February 23, 6:00 – 7:30 P.M.** in the Robert Casanova Room. The Guidance and Counseling Department will present information that is crucial to the college planning process. All 10th graders and their parents are also invited.

Scholarship Searching Especially for 12th Graders

Searching for scholarships can be overwhelming, especially after having completed a rigorous fall of applying to colleges. However, finding money that does not have to be repaid can be well worth the time and effort. There are many scholarships available for students, but finding scholarships that fit for an individual student can be challenging.

complete DeLaSalle experience by participating in our extra-curricular programs.”

Mr. Dennis Jung has been named Region 4 Volleyball Coach of the Year. Jung joined the Islander staff in the fall of 2004 and has been the varsity volleyball coach since 2006. His teams have lived through the ups and downs that most teams experience. Through it all, he has shown a positive attitude, working to build a strong program by incorporating as many opportunities as possible for athletes to play volleyball in the off-season.

Jung said, “I think this [award] reflects more on the dedication of the coaching staff as a whole, as well as the willingness of players to value their training through the summer. Our coaches and players look forward to our weekly summer workouts and annual team camp trip.”

Mr. Sean McMenemy received Region 4’s honors as Football Coach of the Year. He assumed command of the Islander varsity squad in 2009. In that time, the DLS team has placed first every year in the Tri-Metro conference, continuing a string of seven first-place conference titles the football team has posted since 2004. McMenemy’s teams played in the State Quarter-final game at Macalester in 2009 and in the State Semi-Final game in the Metrodome in 2010.

McMenemy said, “We stress that all of the players know that we are a family. They know that the coaches are there to help them. Our players know that they are loved and that they can be proud of their football program — fast-paced and fundamentally sound.

Books such as *How to Go To College Almost For Free*, *The Scholarship Scouting Report*, *Sports Scholarships*, and *The Scholarship Handbook* are available for overnight and weekend check out in the Guidance and Counseling Office. Also, talk to the financial aid office at potential college choices and make sure that you are aware of institutional endowments and scholarships that are available at those colleges. Finally, check with your relatives. Do your parent/s employer, union, church, or service club offer scholarships? Do you have a parent or grandparent who is a veteran? It is possible that if you have a job outside of school that your own employer may offer a scholarship for employees. Keep talking to people and asking questions, there may be some surprising answers.

Know Your School

Who is the school nurse?

The school nurse for DeLaSalle is Ms. Ann Lumbar, who is an employee of the Minneapolis Public Schools. She provides contracted services to DeLaSalle. She is a registered nurse with a nursing degree from the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul in conjunction with the nursing program at St. Catherine University and a masters in nursing from the University of Minnesota.

She is available to see students and staff all day on Tuesdays and in the mornings on Fridays. The Health Office is located in the Main Office, directly behind the front desk.

What health services does the school nurse provide?

On a typical day, Lumbar provides episodic care, health counseling, and consultation services.

The Health Office is responsible for many different medical services. Some of these are:

- making sure student's immunizations are compliant with state law,
- initiating and organizing student health records,
- conducting vision and hearing screenings for all 9th graders and on an as-needed basis for other students,
- identifying health concerns (through health assessments, screening programs, referral by staff, parent or student and record review) and then
- communicating to staff those health concerns that may affect learning or require specific emergency care.

To help a student be more successful in school, the school nurse provides referral, follow-up and assistance in implementation of adaptations for identified health problems. She completes health evaluations for students referred for learning adaptations. An example of adaptations in a school setting would be changing the seating for a student with hearing difficulties or providing a detailed plan for how staff would handle an emergency situation for a student with a specific health concern, e.g. seizures or diabetes.

The school nurse also helps local school staff plan and implement measures for communicable disease control, e.g. influenza, pertussis, etc. She also is a consultant to DLS staff and a liaison for them with community health agencies.

As you can tell, the duties are significant and the Health Office can be a really busy place!
