Christian Brothers Carved in Memory of DeLaSalle

At the invitation of Bishop John Ireland and with \$25,000.00 in seed money, three Christian Brothers came to Minneapolis in 1900 to start a new high school. That first year they taught fifty young men. The school grew quickly, numbering 352 boys by 1914. The school focused on training students for a career in business; hence its original classroom building became known as the "C Building," as in Commercial Building. In 1923 the next building on campus gave the school room to expand its college preparatory curriculum. In time it was called as it is today, the "B Building." In 1959 the "A Building" was opened to house DeLaSalle's growing number of students. By 1964, the student body grew to 1645 students taught by 28 Brothers and a small handful of lay colleagues. With great pride, DeLaSalle graduates referred of themselves as "Brothers' boys."

When nearby St. Anthony of Padua school for girls closed in 1971, DeLaSalle opened its doors to girls. The demographics of the city lowered the student population to 475 by 1975 and to an all-time low of 306 students in 1990-91. Through the leadership of the Brothers and the help of loyal alumni, the school met the financial and enrollment challenges of those days, lifting DeLaSalle from difficult times.

One steady influence throughout all of these changes was the presence of the Christian Brothers and lay colleagues who had also come to embody the Lasallian spirit. Today six Brothers walk the halls of DeLaSalle, serving the school and its students as teacher, administrator, campus minister, journalist, carpenter or repairman. The skills they bring to the campus today represent in a symbolic way the wide variety of talents they have always brought to DE.



In the last twenty-five years the Brothers have quite intentionally shared with their lay colleagues their charism for teaching young people. Today we speak of our Lasallian school staffed by a dedicated group of men and women, laity and vowed Brothers. Our shared mission is "to touched the hearts" of our students, nurturing in them Christian values and strong academics, seasoned with a wide variety of activities that express their wide range of talents.

As the number of Brothers available for service at DeLaSalle lessens, the school faces the reality that at some point, there may no longer be any Brothers at our school. But the memory of what they have given will remain vibrant, as their contributions have always been. With this reality in mind, DeLaSalle dedicated its Christian Brothers Plaza on the north-east corner of its property to all the Christian Brothers who have served or will serve this school community.

Carved at the base of the Founder's park statue are words of St. John Baptist de la Salle: "The greatest miracle you can perform is to touch the hearts of your students." On the statue are the names of all of the Christian Brothers who have served at DeLaSalle 1900-2010. The statue, created by Bro. Jerome Cox, FSC, will be dedicated on May 13, 2011.

The focal point for Christian Brothers Plaza will be a bronze statue crafted by Brother Jerome Cox, FSC, '56, who attended DeLaSalle in his first year of high school before he moved to St. Louis to begin his training to be a Christian Brother. Commissioned in 2008 by Brother Michael Collins, FSC, '55, Brother Jerome designed a statue that represents all of the Brothers who

ever worked at our school. The work is a statue of one Brother wearing the traditional religious robe (or habit) of the order. The name of every Brother who has served at DeLaSalle from 1900 to 2011 is carved onto the robe. The statue holds 170 names representing the 1200 Christian Brothers who have served at DeLaSalle in 110 years. The base of this statue holds an engraving

The following dates and information are provided to make your last days at DeLaSalle less hectic and more enjoyable. Please mark your calendars and share this information with your parents.

Important Dates

Wednesday, May 25 • Graduation practice will take place at 8:59 A.M. at the Basilica of Saint Mary on Hennepin Avenue and is required for all those intending to participate in the graduation ceremony. It is important that everyone be on time. Graduation practice should only take an hour and a half to two hours. Caps, gowns and graduation tickets will be distributed at this time.

Wednesday, May 25 • Parents and graduates will join the school to celebrate the end of the year at the Baccalaureate Mass and recognition ceremony (formerly the Senior Awards Assembly) beginning at 6:30 P.M. in the gym. Space is limited to students and family members.

Thursday, May 26 • Seniors are to be present on the east side of the Basilica of Saint Mary at 6:10 P.M. Graduation will begin promptly at 6:45 P.M. Due to limited space at the Basilica, each graduate will be issued up to eight tickets to invite friends and relatives. Appropriate attire must be worn in order to participate in the commencement exercises (dress pants, dress shoes, and ties for the men, dress pants or dresses, and dress shoes for the women).

Transitions: Seniors and Parents

Whoever said the only thing constant is change was correct. As fall approaches, the class of 2011 and their parents will be going through dramatic changes. Parents' feelings may range from excitement to a sense of loss, and students will be starting a new chapter in their lives. Parents:

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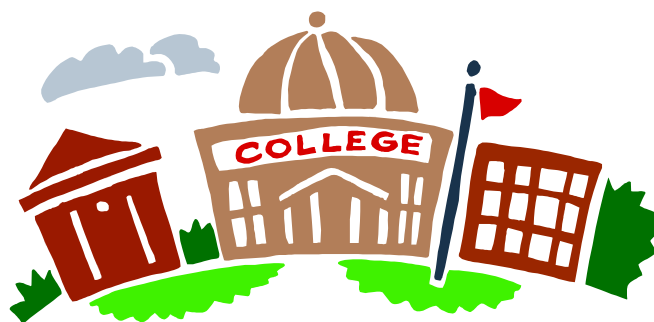

Paris to Barcelona:

Students Fill Spring Break with Trip to Europe

For 33 students and five adult chaperones, DeLaSalle's spring break offered eight days of travel in France and Spain.

Starting in Paris, a city made for walking, they strolled down the grand boulevards and through its pristine parks. They explored Notre Dame Cathedral with its great stone buttresses. They also saw the cafés, bookstores, and cinemas of the Left Bank. Amid all its shops, the DeLaSalle travelers found an apartment where Ernest Hemingway once lived and the tombs of Marie Curie and Victor Hugo. No visit to Paris would be complete without seeing the Louvre, the home of the Mona Lisa, the Arc de Triomphe on the Champs-Élysées, and the Eiffel Tower. They also saw the palace of King Louis XIV-XVI at Versailles, and the Conciergerie, the prison where Marie Antoniette spent her final days before being sent to the guillotine.

After two days in Paris, the DLS troupe boarded the TGV, the "train à grande vitesse" (Europe's fastest train), and headed south to Avignon and Nîmes in Provence. Avignon was once the seat of the Catholic papacy. In Provence the group visited the the Nîmes amphitheater. It was built by the Romans nearly 2,000 years ago and was the site of gladiator and animal combat. It is still used today for theatrical performances and bullfights. In Provence the students enjoyed the change of scenery to a more rural way of life compared to the hustle and bustle of Paris.

The group moved on to the medieval ruins of Baux-de-Provence, the beautiful city carved into a mountain.

The art lovers in the group had the pleasure of going to the Salvador Dali museum in Figueres which was just as eccentric as the artist himself. The group enjoyed a *tapas* and *paella* dinner. Students were surprised to see two languages on the street signs: Spanish and Catalán.

Moving on to Barcelona they saw La Sagrada Família, the famous half-finished church complex by Antoni Gaudí. Further south, they found the site of the 1992 Olympics in Montjuïc.

This little group from Minnesota loved Costa Brava, a seacoast area along the Mediterranean, where they did brisk business with its many gift shops. The next day they took the train back to Barcelona and flew home, packed full with memories of eight days in France and Spain.

All in all, this trip was a good chance for students to see a way of life different from their own and to practice the languages they have taken at DeLaSalle.

Who works in the Business Office?

The Business Office at DeLaSalle is located in the main office off of the Albers Atrium. Within this office area, you will find Ms. Terry Sefcik, Ms. Jill Stricker, and Mr. Brian Lynch.

What do we do?

Ms. Terry Sefcik will be the first face that you see when entering the Business Office. The cheery greeting is the give-a-way. Ms. Sefcik is responsible for handling the accounts payable at the school, as well as ensuring that lunch accounts are loaded with deposits and supporting the multitude of other office needs.

Ms. Jill Stricker is the Business Office Manager and directs the Financial Aid program at DeLaSalle. Ms. Stricker handles the accounts receivables functions for the school.

Mr. Brian Lynch is the Director of Finance and has responsibilities that supervise all financial functions of the school from evaluating projects to leading the audit. The Business Office team works closely on many of the office needs and believes that this team mentality is what leads to its success.

What services are available?





The Business Office is a hub of activity during the school day for students. Deposits for lunch accounts keep the office busy during the midday hours.
