### TYPES OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Merit Based Awarded based upon academic, athletic, or achievement for a special talent. An example would be the National Merit Scholarship Need Based Awarded based upon a student's/family's financial need.

SEPTEMBER

- Identify financial safety schools
- Create FSA ID

• Research scholarships and organize applications (deadlines)

- Submit FAFSA
- Complete CSS Profile (if applicable) or MN Dream Act (if applicable)
- Submit scholarship applications & research institution scholarships

- Review Student Aid Report (SAR)
- Complete verification and other forms
- Submit scholarship applications

### FINANCIAL AID TIMELINE

MARCH

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JUNE-AUGUST

Compare financial aid award letters
Talk to your family and the college's financial aid office

• Tuition deposit typically due May 1

• Make sure to complete any requirements to ensure your scholarships and financial aid. This can include sending your final transcript, your college financial aid statement, your college bill or other paperwork

# MN DREAM ACT

- Unfortunately, if you are undocumented students do not qualify for Federal grants through the FAFSA.
- HOWEVER, undocumented students CAN attend college. Some colleges offer institutional funding and merit-based scholarships for students in this situation. Talk to your college advisor about your options.
   ADDITIONALLY, you may be able to apply for the MN Dream Act!





## MN DREAM ACT

- The MN Dream Act provides certain benefits to undocumented students who meet the certain criteria
- Students who meet the criteria in the MN Dream Act will be eligible to apply for the following benefits:
  - In-state resident tuition rates at Minnesota public colleges and universities.
  - Minnesota state financial aid available to students who meet state residency requirements.
  - Privately funded financial aid through Minnesota public colleges and

## **Cost of Attendance (COA)**

An estimate of the total cost to attend a school for one academic year, including both direct and indirect costs.

## Focus on **net price**, not sticker price.

### Four-year public college

Sticker Price The college's published cost of attendance

#### Grants & Scholarships

Gift aid (free money you don't have to work for or pay back) awarded by the college



#### **Net Price**

The difference between the two — the real amount your family pays (typically with loans, savings and income)

# **Tools to Calculate College Costs**



#### **Net Price Calculator:**

- The Net Price Calculator is a tool that students can use to estimate their "net price" at attend a particular school
- Colleges will estimate based on academic and financial information what kind of aid they might offer



#### FAFSA4caster.ed.gov:

 A calculator that provides an early estimate of your eligibility for federal student aid and estimate of your Expected Family Contribution (EFC).

- Going to college can be a good investment. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, workers with higher levels of education "typically earn more and have lower rates of unemployment compared with workers who have less education." Over a lifetime, reports show that college graduates can earn <u>84 percent more</u> than those with a high school degree.
  However, you don't want to be burdened with student loan dept. That is why it is so important to apply nd attend a school that is a:
  - Personal fit, and...
  - Financial fit, and...
  - Academic fit for you!
